## **Discover & Dream:** Recapturing Vocational Identity and Reimagining Economic Vitality

# Empower and equip your congregation to expand its vision for social impact and access the financial capital needed to realize your community goals.

The African American church has a long history of community-based ministry. That ministry has often included being an anchor institution — a central institution of economic stability and vitality in communities that were often denied participation in banking, lending, and other systems of capital investment.

Now in the 21st century, the African American church in these same communities is facing challenges in rapidly changing and gentrifying contexts. Often, the challenges hinge on the lack of adequate resources and a struggle to develop a vision in the midst of such pressures.

Discover & Dream addresses these challenges. The program aims to increase the creative potential and economic vitality of participating congregations and provide a path to social impact and economic vitality. The 2-year program will engage 10-12 congregational teams in seminars, workshops, peer learning, and mentoring groups. The content will provide a basis of financial competency, rooted in theological commitment toward creativity and imagination. Congregational teams will apply their learnings in an experimental initiative that demonstrates their vocational identity, serves the community, and enhances their congregation's economic vitality.

Participating congregations that identify a viable social impact real estate development project will be eligible to apply for social impact lending programs that can help to transform communities of color.

### Eligibility and selection criteria:

African American churches in the Washington DC Metro area (DMV) that are:

- · Committed to community engagement
- · Actively seeking vitality in a changing cultural context
- · Ready to connect their prophetic imagination and economic imagination
- Revisioning ministry and leading change

There is no fee to participate, but the teams must have access to internet service to participate in this primarily online program.

Discover & Dream is a two-year program that aims to increase the economic vitality and creative potential of African-American congregations that leads to sustainable revitalization of churches and their surrounding communities.

Selected congregations will commit a team of 5-7 members (must include the pastor) to actively participate in monthly online classes, engage with online peer groups, and develop an experimental initiative that serves the community and enhances the congregation's economic vitality. There is no fee to participate, but space is limited to 10-12 congregational teams.
